Sakeliga's legal efforts were instrumental in shielding businesses from undue prosecution during the health crisis, safeguarding property from unwarranted intrusion, and robustly checking the abuse of state power in litigation tied to the "State of Disaster" and health regulations.

Sakeliga successfully challenged the government's business licence requirement during the Covid lockdown preventing businesses from facing prosecution and harassment for not possessing such certificates and avoiding proposed permanent business licencing.		Sakeliga's involvement as a friend of the court in the Fidelity case was crucial in recognising property, as it ensured that firearm owners could re-apply for licenses for firearms with expired licences, thus safeguarding their property.		Sakeliga's litigation was essential in accelerating the end of the "State of Disaster" (SOD) and pushed back against state overreach, protected constitutional principles, and checked abuses of power in cases related to emergency regulations and state interference.
